• <u>Wetland buffer analysis – GIS training</u> Paul shared the application (below) for the UNH consulting program Connect to Protect. This program could help the CC to implement the Wetland Permit Planning tool as developed by Marc Jacobs and the CC.

2024 Connect to Protect Technical Assistance Application

Members of the *Connect to Protect* team are available to collaborate with municipalities and conservation organizations to support use of the 2021 *NH Coastal Watershed Conservation Plan* in conservation planning and land protection. Assistance is available between March and December 2024.

The BCC is in the process of developing and evaluating a method to quantitatively

evaluate the impact of wetland buffer impingement. The method has been developed

in conjunction with a Wetland Scientist Consultant, and make use of two GIS services,

the Wetland Permit Planning Tool (WPPT) from NHDES, and GranitView, developed

by UNH. A problem with the method developed is that because we do not have the expertise

to integrate proposed development mapping with these tools, we are unable to

determine with sufficient accuracy the extent of impingement on wetlands buffers.

The BCC is seeking funding and assistance to obtain the GIS training and

skills to ensure that the Wetland Assessment Method described above

would provide spatial resolution results accurate enough to be used in

to provide guidance to support decisions on Special Use Permit Applications

to the Town Planning Board.

How will this build on past or ongoing work? (1-2 sentences is fine)

The BCC, has contracted for, and received, the "Barrington Wetland Assessment

Method" from Marc Jacobs, Certified Wetland & Soil Scientist. We are currently

in an evaluation phase to determine the feasibility and ease with which this tool

can be applied by the BCC to advise the Barrington Planning Board in its decision

on applications by builders, developers, and homeowners, for wetland buffer reductions. Is there a timeframe during 2024 that would work best for your group? The Connect to Protect team anticipates working with each group for approximately a 3-4 month window during the year, and this window can be flexible based on what works best for your community/organization.

The intent of this work is to propose a modification to the Town Zoning Ordinance

which would potentially require applicants for Special Use Permits to go through

this evaluation process if the result of the trial period support it. We expect a few

iterations will be necessary before we can stabilize the method and results. For this

reason we would like to work on modifications as soon as possible in order to have

results in time for the 2025 Town Meeting Warrant. This would require work to

be completed in the October/November 2024 timeframe.

It is anticipated that two studies will be done, one to look at wildlife and plants and another to look at what could happen to the wetland if the dam were breached.
- <u>Dudzik land conservation</u> Doug stated that the Swains Lake Village District has received additional grant money to put toward the land purchase.
- <u>Purchase of lots 248-0001 and 248-0002 to expand Town Forest</u> Paul will bring this up at the upcoming Lands Committee meeting.

108-1-GR/HCO-24-3Lots (Owner: Carolyn Bedford Revoc Tr Trustee Hilary

Parkhurst) Ayers Lake Campground. This proposal is requesting one property to be divided into three properties, with no new driveways proposed at this time. Dan brought up the Ayers Lake Association concern that the septic system(s) for the 10 cabins is not valid. The septic system issue would come up with any future subdivision plans, but the CC had no comment on the plans as currently presented. If/when any development comes in the future, the CC would review the plans.
