- The Select Board approved the Goodwill Amendment and Panish easement.
  - John mentioned that Duane Hyde sent the easement language to DES, and DES is changing some wording regarding water supply.
- Ken brought up that the Select Board expressed concern with the
   Richardson Dam. John suggested that the dam would be under town
   jurisdiction as town owned property. There was discussion about the
   responsibility for payment of dam repair. John will look at previous notes
   pertaining to this.
- John will check with Conner regarding the need for a **Goodwill parking lot** preconstruction meeting with Brown Industrial.
- Ken will talk with Peter Royce about the use of the **SATWaSR stewardship fund** (\$2,706.29) It was mentioned that this could be used for forest management.
- Conner suggested putting out a design/build bid for the **Seavey Bridge Road parking lot**. John will put a statement together for this bid.
- Memo from Peter Rowell and Lauren Chase-Rowell to review. Ken talked with Peter and Lauren and will have further contact with them regarding possible land conservation.
- Marika asked who might be responsible for mowing the parking area at the SATWaSR parking lot off 125. It was also brought up that the grass off Town Farm Road on the Calef Trail could be mowed. Ken will check with Charlie (Trails Committee) about this.
