Ken will note this in a memo to the PB, and the CC will request a site walk. <u>251-9-GR-22-SR (Owners: Tyler & Katie Rand)</u> It is requested that this case come back to the CC when it is more detailed.

<u>239-35-V-22-17Sub (Owner: Paul Guptill)</u> Jack expressed concerns with the snowmobile trail being a problem to the homeowners. Ken will mention this on his PB memo.
