

The Barrington Trails Committee meeting on 7/14/22 was held at the ECLC

Meeting was called to order at: 6:35pm.

Plans for the Tricentennial Parade were discussed. Ted, John, Jack and Charlie will be walking. Parking will be at the BES with a shuttle to take participants to the start of the parade at Turbocam.

New Business:
