

BARRINGTON, NH SELECT BOARD MINUTES

MONDAY, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020

The Select Board meeting for Monday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020 began at 6:30 p.m. The meeting was held by remote participation via a Microsoft Teams Meeting due to the COVID-19 pandemic, in accordance with <u>Emergency Order #12</u>, pursuant to <u>Executive Order 2020-04</u>. In attendance were Chairperson Hardekopf, Vice-Chair Knapp, Selectperson Bailey, Selectperson Saccoccia, Town Administrator (TA) MacIver, Municipal Office Administrator (MOA) Caudle, as well as Advisory Budget Committee (ABC) Chair Steve Saunders, member Dannen Mannschreck, and Town Treasurer Peter Royce.

### **Budget Presentation - Library**

**6:41pm.** Melissa Huette, Library Director, shared that 225 years ago today the Barrington Social Library was formed (November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1795). The first librarian was Rev. Benjamin A. Balch, who was also the clerk and served for 15 years. The first members paid 18 shillings, followed by annual dues of two shillings, and for 26 years there was no physical location until it was established in the home of Jeremiah Kingman. In 1954, the Library was temporarily housed in a closet under the stairs in the Grade School.

Details regarding significant budget changes were reviewed, including the impacts that COVID-19 have had on various budget lines, and increases in costs for annual/monthly dues and fees. All budget documents are available for review by visiting <u>Library-Section 18</u> on the <u>2021 Budget</u>

<u>page</u>. The Library is currently open and practicing COVID-19 precautions, and the Library Trustees have voted to waive all fees and fines for the duration of the declared pandemic.

Lindsey Maziarz, Chair of the Library Trustees, presented information about the proposed Library Warrant Article and an update on the Library project, including funding sources and pledges vs. funds received from donations. The ABC requested more details regarding what impacts a change in square footage would create, and Melissa spoke to the reasons for the warrant article request.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

7:26pm. Public comments are limited to three minutes per person, and a total of 15 minutes.

Leigh Elliott, Vice-Chair of Library Trustees – spoke to the importance of looking out for the people who work in the building and raised specific safety concerns.

Lindsey Maziarz, Chair of Library Trustees – shared that in two years a small group of concerned residents joined up and raised more than \$250,000, and her belief that moving that momentum forward is important.

Vice-Chair Knapp – requested Melissa and Conner meet and discuss safety issues raised in Public Comment.

Selectperson Bailey – Thanked Vice-Chair Knapp for comments.

There were no additional public comments. Public comment was closed at 7:29pm.
