

BARRINGTON, NH SELECT BOARD MINUTES

MONDAY, November 9th, 2020

The Select Board meeting for Monday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020 began at 6:30 p.m. The meeting was held by remote participation via a Microsoft Teams Meeting due to the COVID-19 pandemic, in accordance with <u>Emergency Order #12</u>, pursuant to <u>Executive Order 2020-04</u>. In attendance were Chairperson Hardekopf, Vice-Chair Knapp, Selectperson Bailey, Selectperson Saccoccia, Town Administrator (TA) Maclver, Municipal Office Administrator (MOA) Caudle, as well as Advisory Budget Committee (ABC) Chair Steve Saunders.

**6:30pm**. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Hardekopf.

**6:30pm.** Chairperson Hardekopf read the emergency provisions of the State of Emergency and explained how this meeting is accessible as well as how to access future meetings.

# **ROLL CALL ATTENDANCE**

**6:32pm** Select Board attendance was taken via Roll Call: Ayer – Present, Bailey – Present, Knapp – Present, Saccoccia – Present, Hardekopf - Present. Each Select Board member shared their location and stated that at present, they were alone in their respective rooms with no one influencing their votes.

# **Budget Presentation – Police**

**6:34pm.** Police Chief George Joy shared the story of Barrington's lost silver treasure. Following "The Year Without a Summer" of 1816, silver coins that had been accumulated by the Hayes family during the famine in trade for crops were lost in the woods near the family's home. Though the family searched, the coins were not recovered, and there are no reports of them having been recovered since.

During the budget presentation, various lines were reviewed, including wage lines, court fees, and some Covid-19 impacts. <u>Responses to questions posed by the ABC</u> were provided. Chief Joy shared the Department has been planning ahead for some purchases due to likely availability issues for some items, including vehicles and ammunition. Questions and concerns were raised about vehicle maintenance, idle time, details and detail fees, detail fees and retirements, and donations to the Police union. Clarification and confirmation was given that the Select Board has not moved to defund the Police Department.
