The Barrington Planning Board met at 5:30 PM at Barrington Shores Drive. The Owner Mr. Todd Green of Barrington Shores, LLC was present. Robin Farwell, of Farwell Engineering explained the plan as the abutters walked with the Board through the site. Ray Bisson of Stonewell Surveying was also present. They also looked at the existing sites. Some comment was made to impervious lot coverage.

Mr. Farwell pointed out the existing leach field would be replaced with the latest design. Members looked at the layout of the proposed sites and roadway. There was discussion by abutters of the proposed location for the buffer and the planting of trees. The abutters discussed a need for the fence to be 6' to 8' high. There was discussion on how the topography would work with the buffer.

While on the walk down by the shoreline the Board observed boats tied along the shore, some members made comments regarding the number of boats.
