Fixed Assets Policy

I. PURPOSE

This policy outlines the qualifications and depreciation guidelines for capital assets.

II. POLICY

The following table depicts the balance sheet of classifications of capital asset items, the dollar level at which the items will be capitalized, and whether the item is depreciated.

1. Exceptions:

There are some items that, due to their nature, should be treated differently.

- a. Normal maintenance, even over \$10,000, should not normally appear on asset listing unless there is a substantial change in value of the asset. Examples are engine replacement to keep a truck working or normal roof replacement that does not substantially increase the value of the item.
- b. Assets can be restated downward due to a substantial unexpected loss of value, for example from wind, fire, or flood.

2. Depreciation:

Straight-line method will be used when calculating depreciation, taking into consideration salvage value at the end of the asset's life. No asset can depreciate to \$0 except infrastructure. This would include the annual paving line since this has an expected life when it will be redone in the future. The following table depicts the depreciable life of capital assets.
