TOWN REPORT

It is Town Meeting season again. We invite everyone to be involved, to make their opinions known and to vote on the issues. The Board of Selectmen plan to meet at the Early Childhood Learning Center at 6:30 PM on December 18, January 8, 15, 22, and 29 and welcomes comments as it works on the budget. There will be a public hearing on a possible bond and the budget on January 8. January 15 there may be a second public hearing. The Deliberative Session of Town Meeting will be at the Middle School Saturday February 3 starting at 9 AM. The opportunity for all voters to elect officers and to vote on zoning articles, the operating budget and other articles is March 13 from 8 AM to 7 PM at the Middle School.

One important need, which is still under discussion by the Board of Selectmen, is what to do about serious deficiencies at the Police Station. There are major issues that put staff at risk of potential violation of State and Federal regulations. Some could even place staff and the public in danger of physical harm. These must be immediately addressed, but can

only be done so with much more space than is available in the current Public Safety Building. It is also clear the Fire Department will need space for future expansion. The Lean Process has been used to analyze space needs and utilization for both Police and Fire. A conceptual plan is being developed. The Board of Selectmen is looking at how best to address this crisis in a cost effective way. It is anticipated there will be a warrant article to address this critical issue at Town Meeting. A second major need that will be addressed in a warrant article at Town Meeting is replacement of Mallego Road Bridge. The State of New Hampshire has 'red-listed' the bridge because it determined there are serious deficiencies in need of major improvements or if things deteriorate further, closure of the bridge. The State has agreed to fund 80% of the anticipated \$1,300,000 replacement cost, if the town pays 20%. It is anticipated the Board will recommend use of fund balance for this 20% match, resulting in no tax impact.

On a different note, the Town has a new Website which is designed to be more user-friendly including being much easier to read and use on smart phones. We welcome suggestions and photos for the site. We encourage you to visit www.barrington.nh.gov and learn more about the community and what is happening. You also have the opportunity to sign up for notices from police, fire, recreation, and other departments as well as minutes of minutes sent directly to your email. You are also welcome to check out our Facebook pages.

Finally we remind everyone that there is no parking on any public street in Barrington. This is especially important during times of winter snow operation by the Public Works Department. Parked vehicles make it difficult to clear the snow and put both the illegally parked car and town vehicles at risk of accident. They can be towed at the owner's risk with the owner responsible for the cost of towing, storage and the fine. Also we remind everyone it is illegal to push or blow snow into the road or to allow water to flow onto the roadway. Please cooperate with the Department of Public Works and the Police to keep everyone safe.

Voter Registration

Not registered to vote in Barrington?

Register at the Town Clerk's Office before the end of the year to avoid the lines at the registration tables.

You should be prepared to present proof of citizenship, age and domicile.

Citizenship: A birth certificate, a passport, and naturalization papers if the applicant is a naturalized citizen, or any other reasonable documentation which indicates the applicant is a U.S. citizen. If none of these is available, an Affidavit of Citizenship may be completed.

Age: Any reasonable documentation indicating the applicant is 18 years of age or older.

Domicile: Any of the following documents can be submitted as presumptive evidence that the applicant meets the domicile requirement: NH driver's license with Barrington address, NH vehicle registration with a Barrington address, a lease or utility bill with current address. If these are not available, the applicant may complete an Affidavit of Domicile.

\$3.00 Residents who are 65 years old by January 1, 2018 may register one dog at the rate of \$3.00.

*** Notice to Veterans ***On March 14, 2017 the town voted to change the criteria for the Veterans credit.

PLEASE READ BELOW:

Article 31 Petition to Expand Veteran's Tax Credit Shall the Town of Barrington vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 72:28-b, All Veteran's Tax Credit? If adopted, the credit will be available to any resident or the spouse or surviving spouse of any resident, who (1) served not less than 90 days on active service in the armed forces of the United States and was honorably discharged or an officer honorably separated from service, provided that Title 10 training for active duty by a member of a national guard or reserve shall be included as service under this paragraph; provided however that the person is not eligible for and is not receiving a credit under RSA 72:28 or RSA 72:35. If adopted, the credit granted will be \$450, the same amount as the standard or optional veteran's tax credit voted by the Town of Barrington under RSA 72:28. (By Petition) Recommended by the Board of Selectmen by a 3-2 vote and by the Advisory Budget Committee (2-1). Passage of this article is anticipated to raise the property taxes on a \$250,000 home \$27.50 (11 cents/\$1000) assessment). Article 31 was voted on and passed on March 14, 2017.

With winter upon us, The Barrington Highway Department would like to remind residents, Ice and Snow take it slow! Our snowplow drivers have a big responsibility and need full cooperation from drivers to complete their job safely. When you see the Highway Department Crews out in Town, please show them respect by being patient, slowing down and giving them plenty of room to work. Sometimes their views and hearing can be impaired by the equipment they are using. Here are a few safety tips to keep in mind while on the roads this winter season:

Low visibility-When the snowplow is being driven, it can create a snow cloud behind it. This can greatly reduce visibility, be patient!

Keep your distance- Plow operators can't see directly behind their trucks, keeping a safe distance will protect you from possible injury and protect your car from salt/sand being applied to the road.

Slow Down- Winter driving requires motorists to be careful and alert, and to slow down! Please allow yourself enough time to get to where you need to go.

Parking

Please remember that the Town of Barrington has a year round parking ordinance that bans parking on all town roads. Any vehicles obstructing snow and ice removal operations will be towed at the direction of the Barrington Police Department and at the owner's expense.

Placement of Snow

The Town of Barrington has an ordinance against snow being plowed, shoveled, blown or places onto a Town road or across the road to the opposite side. The Barrington Police Department will do enforcement.

*Pushing snow on roadways creates many hazards for the BHD snow plow operators and the general public including:


Drainage problems

Drifting

Sight obstruction

Slippery areas and

Frozen ruts or bumps that can contribute to motor vehicle crashes.





Snow Fort Warning!

Kids love to make snow forts and igloos on top of and inside big piles of snow. It's natural for kids to want to play in the biggest snow pile, because it makes for a bigger fort. But the biggest snow piles are often close to the road, which creates an extreme hazard for children when snowplows are in operation. Please be aware that even after the snow has stopped, snowplows may still be "pushing back" snow to widen travel lanes, and may not see your child if he/she is

playing in a snow pile close to the road. So have fun with snow forts and igloos, but well away from the road.

Mailboxes

Mail and newspaper boxes are allowed in the Town's right of way at the homeowner's risk. The following are suggestions for resolving the possibility of damage. 1. Mailboxes should, whenever possible be installed a minimum of at least 3 feet from the edge of the pavement. 2. Installation should be sufficiently sturdy to withstand the weight of heavy snow resulting from plowing operations.

The Town of Barrington does not replace mailboxes.

Trash Receptacles

If you have your trash picked up, please make sure that all bins are at least 10-15 feet in your driveway and not on the side of the road during snow removal operations.

Sand

Sand is available to the residents of Barrington and is located in the Citizens shed outside the Transfer Station gate. Residents are limited to 3 five gallon buckets. Bring your own container and shovel.


