### **TOWN REPORT**

Election Day for Town Meeting saw a foot and a half of snow with gusty winds and difficult travel, however because the New Hampshire Attorney General and the Secretary of State had forbid the meeting being moved to a different day, it proceeded as scheduled. The NH Legislature is working on a bill to allow the meeting to be moved in this kind of situation, but only time will tell if it adopted and helps. The key issue for the Legislature is whether this should be a local decision or is it something that will come out of Concord. Some towns saw the voter turnout fall below 10%. In Barrington almost 900 braved the weather to vote. We appreciate that effort.

All but one of the funding articles that were requested by the School and Town were approved, including a collective bargaining agreement for police. The largest project approved is funding to replace the "red listed" Mallego Road

Bridge. While this will cost \$1,300,000, 80% of the funding will come from NH Department of Transportation. Both the Town and School operating budgets were approved as were the regular requests to set aside money for a variety of capital projects. The Town approved entering into a 9 year contract with Waste Management for disposal of recyclables and solid waste collected at the Transfer Station. The price that is locked in for this service is projected to rise much slower than the rate the cost would otherwise increase. This also guarantees the town a disposal place for 9 years in a regional environment that will see fewer disposal sites.

The one funding article that failed was to start setting aside money to build town offices. Currently the town rents space on a year to year lease. Owning is a less expensive long-term option and provides greater long-term stability. The issue will not go away. There are other major projects on the horizon. The Town will need to replace Green Hill Road Bridge at a cost of well over \$2,000,000, but as with Mallego Road Bridge there is 80% state funding. There are space needs for the library and recreation programs. The most pressing need that I believe will need to be a priority in 2019 is the police station. There are risks to the public and employees because of shortcomings at the police station. The Board continues to look at options with an expectation to propose a solution by next Town Meeting. Finally the Highway Department deserves a huge thank you for their excellent work clearing roads this winter.

### Not registered to vote in Barrington?

Register at the Town Clerk's Office before the end of the year to avoid the lines at the registration tables.

You should be prepared to present proof of citizenship, age and domicile.

**Citizenship:** A birth certificate, a passport, and naturalization papers if the applicant is a naturalized citizen, or any other reasonable documentation which indicates the applicant is a U.S. citizen. If none of these is available, an Affidavit of Citizenship may be completed.

**Age:** Any reasonable documentation indicating the applicant is 18 years of age or older.

**Domicile:** Any of the following documents can be submitted as presumptive evidence that the applicant meets the domicile requirement: NH driver's license with Barrington address, NH vehicle registration with a Barrington address, a lease or utility bill with current address. If these are not available, the applicant may complete an Affidavit of Domicile.

The LAST day to change your party affiliation is Tuesday June 5, 2018

\$3.00 Residents who are 65 years old by January 1, 2018 may register **one** dog at the rate of \$3.00.

# Fire Department



### Campfires and Open Burning

As winter begins to fade away and spring and summer are just around the corner our thoughts turn to outside campfires. We encourage safe open campfires. By state regulations a written permit is required for any open burning unless there is total snow cover 100 feet in all directions around your burn area.

There are two types of permits that we issue Seasonal Campfire permits and Brush Permits.

- Seasonal Campfire permits are issued for any cooking or campfire pits. They are good from 5pm-9am weather permitting. Please call the station for more information or to schedule an inspection.
- Brush permits are issued for after 5pm (Weather permitting) or during the day if it is going to rain all day. Please call the station for more information.

Trash burning is strictly forbidden in NH and could result in a \$2000 fine and up to a year in jail. Mail, personal papers and newspapers are all considered illegal to burn.

Permits are now required for all open burning in town. Burning without a written permit is subject to a \$2000 fine.

We are required by law to come to your home and inspect all campfire sites prior to use.

Renters must have written permission from the land owners before a permit can be issued.

Please help us make this a safe fire season for everyone. Call the station for more information or to schedule an inspection. 664-2241.

# Department of Public Works—Highway Dept.

New to Town, not sure how things work, or have a question on the proper disposal of an item? Please see the Transfer Station Attendant or call 664-0166.



The Highway Department would like to take a minute and thank the residents of Barrington for once again doing their part and abiding to the year round parking ordinance and snow ordinance. Winter can be a difficult and trying time for all of us. We thank you for your patience and cooperation!

Mud season-New England's fifth season: It's hard to think about warmer weather when there is still snow on the ground, but spring is right around the corner and with spring comes mud season. Mud season occurs only in places where the ground freezes deeply in winter, is covered by snow, and thaws in the spring. Dirt roads and paths become muddy because the deeply frozen ground thaws from the surface down as the air temperature warms above freezing. The Highway Department will try its best with keeping the Town's dirt roads passable at all times. Please slow down and use your best judgment when traveling down dirt roads during mud season.





Tips for avoiding pothole damage:

- \*Leave extra space between you and the car in front of you.
- \*Make sure your tires are properly inflated.
- \* Slow down!
- \*Avoid puddles it may be concealing a deep pothole.

Friendly reminder that mail and newspaper boxes are allowed in the Town's right of way at the homeowner's risk. The following are suggestions for resolving the possibility of damage. 1. Mailboxes should, whenever possible be installed a minimum of at least three feet from the edge of the pavement. 2. Installation should be sufficiently sturdy to withstand the weight of heavy snow resulting from plowing operations. The Town of Barrington does not replace mailboxes

# Department of Public Works-Transfer Station

We are still having an issue with non-recyclable materials ending up mixed in with recyclable material. Please make sure we are recycling the appropriate materials and that your recyclables are rinsed and as clean as possible. A list of acceptable recyclables are located on the Transfer Station website or call the office with any questions.

Please note that the transfer station is a pay as you throw facility and there is a fee associated for most of the items that are to be disposed of; bulk, demo, electronics and white goods. If you have any questions please see the transfer station attendant before disposing of any material. Recycle that cardboard box!! Many online purchases arrive in cardboard boxes, by recycling cardboard, you are helping to make new and useful products. Cardboard can be recycled five to seven times and is a generally straightforward and easy material to recycle here are six handy tips to get you started:

- 1. Remove any box packing materials such as packing peanuts or Styrofoam.
- 2. You don't need to worry about removing any tape or labels from your cardboard boxes. They will be removed in the recycling process.
- 3. If your box is dented, bent, ripped or damaged, that's okay. It can still be recycled as long as it is dry and clean.
- 4. Keep your boxes dry. If your boxes get wet allow them to dry before recycling them.
- 5. Keep your boxes clean and away from food products such as oil and grease! A greasy or heavily food-stained box cannot be recycled.
- 6. Flatten your cardboard boxes or rip them up before placing them in your recycling bin or the compactor. This will save space.

Think before you shred! Shred only documents with sensitive information. Shredding shortens paper fibers, recycling whole pieces keeps the fibers long, strong and ready to be made into new paper. Improve recycling by putting non-sensitive papers straight in the recycling bin.

\*We are a **pay as you throw facility** household trash should be in Green Town of Barrington Trash bags. Package of Large 33 gallon bags 10 count -\$13.00. Package of small 15 gallon bags 10 count-\$9.00.



- \*Bulk items and Electronic items have a fee to dispose of them, please see the Transfer Station attendant for pricing. The price list is also located on our website.
- \*We are a single stream recycling facility; all recyclable material can go in one container. Not everything is recyclable!!! Please check out the recycling chart.
- \*Make sure you get your Barrington Transfer Station permit sticker; you will need to show a valid I.D. or current bill with your Barrington address on it.
- \*Cash or check are the only method of payment that is accepted at the Transfer Station.
- \*Plastic bags are not recycled at the Transfer Station, please re-use them or bring them back to your local grocery store to be recycled. Did you know that on average plastic bags take a 1,000 years to break down!

### Welcome to our New Library Director


