TOWN REPORT

With a convenient geographical location and excellent programming, Barrington is a fantastic place to celebrate summer. The Barrington Public Library and Barrington Recreation offer a wide variety of activities, many of which are included in this issue of the Town Common. Currently, the Recreation Commission is replacing the playground located on Ramsdell Lane, next to the Barrington Public Library and the Barrington Recreation office. The upgrade includes new equipment as well as improved access providing new opportunities for young children to play in a safe, colorful and stimulating environment.

Summer is a wonderful time to consider hiking and enjoying the many acres of natural surroundings conserved by the Town. While the SELT Stonehouse Forest is our newest addition to these properties, it is one of many conservation areas open to the public including but not limited to: the A. Harlan Calef Isinglass Preserve on Town Farm Road; where a parking area has been constructed and the Samuel A. Tamposi Water Supply Reserve (SATWaSR); with parking on Route 125 south of Liberty Truck near the town line. A

comprehensive list can be found on the Barrington Conservation Commission website: www.barringtonconcom.org.

The Select Board continues its long-term focus on infrastructure. The owners of the property where Town Hall is located have agreed to another 1 year extension of the lease. The Police Department is developing solutions to address the necessary upgrades and improvements to their portion of the Public Safety Building.

Engineering continues for the 2019 replacement of the Mallego Road bridge with the Greenhill Road bridge to follow. The State of New Hampshire has agreed to fund 80% of the cost of these two projects. The 2018 budget included approximately \$700,000 for road improvements. Road paving falls into 3 different categories: Overlay, Reclamation or Wear Course. Overlay adds 2 ½ inches of pavement to the existing road, increasing the thickness of the pavement. Reclamation includes grinding up and reshaping the existing road, then installing a new 2 ½ inch layer of pavement. Wear Course adds a 1 ½ inch protective layer of newer and tougher pavement over the existing road. The Select Board has approved Overlay on: Calef Island Road, Muchado Drive, Beauty Hill Road by Ross Road to Hall Road and Boulder Drive. Caldwell Lane, Boyle Lane, Evans Road, Morgan's Way, Bear Creek Road and Captain Bud's Lane will all be Reclaimed. Mast Road, Robinson Lane, Hillside Drive, Wildcat Road, France Road and Mica Point Road will all be enhanced with Wear Course.

As always, our objective is to maintain and better the Town's property for the safe use and enjoyment of the residents. Have a wonderful and fulfilling summer!

Not registered to vote in Barrington?

Register at the Town Clerk's Office to avoid the lines at the registration tables. You should be prepared to present proof of citizenship, age and domicile:

Citizenship: A birth certificate, a passport, and naturalization papers if the applicant is a naturalized citizen, or any other reasonable documentation which indicates the applicant is a U.S. citizen. If none of these is available, an Affidavit of Citizenship may be completed.

Age: Any reasonable documentation indicating the applicant is 18 years of age or older.

Domicile: Any of the following documents can be submitted as presumptive evidence that the applicant meets the domicile requirement: NH driver's license with Barrington address, NH vehicle registration with a Barrington address, a lease or utility bill with current address.

Have you licensed your dog?
All dogs were to be licensed in New Hampshire by APRIL 30th of every year per RSA 466:1



What happens if I don't license my dog?

Failure to license your dog is a violation of State law. Owners who fail to register their dog by June 1 may be subject to fines and a court summons. Beginning June 1 late charges are assessed at \$1.00 per month, per dog as well as the original licensing fees. Civil forfeiture fines will also be assessed in the amount of \$25.00 per dog plus a \$7.00 service fee, which will be payable within 15 days of receipt of the notice of failure to register. Failure to pay late charges, licensing fees and civil forfeiture fees within the 15 day period may result in a summons to appear in court.

What do I do if I no longer own my dog?

Contact the Town Clerk's Office at 603-664-5476, and we will update your record so that you do not receive any further notices for the dog(s) you no longer own.

Residents will be able to license their dog(s) for the year 2018 with proof of:

- 1) current rabies vaccination certificate
- 2) spaying/neutering certificate

\$7.50 Spayed, neutered and dogs under 7 months old

\$10.00 Dog(s) that are not spayed or neutered and older than 7 months

<u>\$3.00</u> Residents who are 65 years old by January 1, 2018 may register <u>one</u> dog at the rate of \$3.00 Residents may mail copies of certificates along with a check made out to: **Barrington Town Clerk.**

Town of Barrington Road Projects for 2018 have started, please check our website or our Facebook page for updates. Remember to use caution in work zones and reduce your speed. Summer maintenance of mowing and ditching has begun, be on the lookout for Highway crews working in the road. As always when you see the Highway crews out in Town, please show them some respect by being patient, slowing down and giving them plenty of room. Sometimes their view and hearing are impaired by the equipment they are using.

Drivers should be extra cautious in looking for child pedestrians and bicyclists during the summer.

Tips for Drivers:

- Be alert, especially in residential areas.
- Expect the unexpected. Children may cross the street at the wrong place or suddenly run or ride in front of you.
- Obey all laws. Slow down if there are children along the road or crossing the street. Come to a full stop at intersections.
- Be predictable. Don't make sudden maneuvers that others, particularly children on foot or on a bicycle, are not expecting.
- Double check behind you and around you when backing out of a driveway or parking space.
- Don't be distracted. Put down the coffee, put down the cell phone, and put both hands on the wheel. Avoid distractions within your vehicle, including loud music.
- Yield the right of way to pedestrians. It isn't just courteous, it's the law.
- Parents can help by reminding their children about staying safe on the roads.









New to Town

- We are a **pay as you throw** facility, Trash should be in Green Town of Barrington Trash bags. Package of large 33 gallon bags 10 count -\$13.00. Package of small 15 gallon bags 10 count-\$9.00, They can be purchased at the Transfer Station, Calef's Country Store, George Calef Fine Foods, Aubuchon Hardware (Lee) and Market Basket (Lee)
- Bulk items and Electronic items have a **fee** to dispose of them, please see the Transfer Station Attendant for pricing. The price list is also located on our website.
- We are a Single Stream recycling facility- all recyclable material can go in one container! There is no cost to recycle,
- Check out the recycling chart on our website.
- Make sure you get your Barrington Transfer Station Permit Sticker, you will need to show a valid I.D. or current bill with you Barrington address on it.
- Cash or Check are the only method of payment that is accepted at the Transfer Station
- Plastic bags are not recycled at the Transfer Station, please re-use them or bring them back to your local grocery store to be recycled. Did you know that on average plastic bags take a 1,000 years to break down?!

Disposal Fee Reminder

Please note if you have items to dispose of at the Transfer Station there is a fee. Please see a Transfer Station Attendant before disposing of any items. Price lists are available at the Transfer Station and on our website: https://www.barrington.nh.gov/sites/barringtonnh/files/uploads/user_fees_0.pdf

Please note that the Town of Barrington Trash bags are for household garbage, please do not put in electronics, metal, wood etc. These items needs to be disposed of in a different container. If you have any questions please call the Transfer Station at 664-2446.

Please take an extra minute and make sure your recyclables are free of anything that cannot be recycled. We are finding a lot of items that are being thrown into the recycling compactors. Imagine what we are not catching!! Clothes, electronics, pots and pans, footwear, bathroom garbage are just a few examples of items that are being disposed of in the recycling compactor.
