Town Administrator Report December 7, 2020 Select Board Meeting

RSA 91-A Emergency Provisions

 - 1. The Committee supports the Select Board's request to extend the hours on Tuesday to 6pm and reduce the hours on Saturday to 4pm.

This decision was never implemented, and a recent legal review raises concerns about the decision.

3. Old Business

- a. New Town Hall Update Discussion
 - i. Progress is continuing on the new Town Hall project. Although the project has experienced delays, I believe we are back on track. The delays have primarily been due to State approvals on the original subdivision. Construction activities cannot commence on the Town Hall lot until the larger subdivision is fully approved. Please review the timeline below regarding past and upcoming milestones.
 - 1. <u>March 12, 2019</u>: New Town Hall project received voter support.
 - 2. <u>March through May 2019</u>: The Select Board formulated and appointed members to the Town Hall Building Committee.
 - 3. <u>May 29, 2019</u>: The Town Hall Building Committee began meeting to develop a Request for Qualifications for the New Town Hall project.
 - 4. <u>August 27, 2019</u>: The Request for Qualifications was advertised.
 - 5. <u>October 7, 2019</u>: The Select Board supported the Town Hall Building Committee's recommendation to select Careno Construction as the design-build contractor for the new Town Hall project.
 - 6. <u>October 2019 through March 2020</u>: The contractor and Town Hall Building Committee developed and refined plans for the new Town Hall.
 - 7. <u>April 21, 2020</u>: The new Town Hall project received conditional approval from the Planning Board.
 - 8. <u>May through July 2020</u>: The contractor has worked with the Town Hall Building Committee to finalize design development.
 - 9. <u>July 2020</u>: The subdivision creating the Town Hall was redesigned in order to meet the requirements of the NH Department of Transportation for permitting.
 - 10. <u>September 11, 2020</u>: The new Town Hall design received approval for the Alteration of Terrain permit from the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services.
 - 11. <u>November 3, 2020</u>: The new subdivision design received conditional approval from the Planning Board.
 - 12. <u>November 2020 through February 2021</u>: The original subdivision is expected to receive State permits and be finalized; construction activities can commence.



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- 13. <u>Spring through Winter 2021 (anticipated)</u>: The new Town Hall project will be constructed.
- ii. Recognizing the project delays and construction cost inflation from 2019 (when the project was approved) to 2021 (when the project is expected to be constructed), the contractor has suggested that the Select Board evaluate additional appropriations in order to avoid impacts to the building's design, floor plan, square footage or finishes.

- b. Extend Waiver of Site Review Requirements Vote
 - i. On May 11, 2020, when indoor dining and entertainment was limited, the Select Board voted to waive the enforcement of site review requirements in order to allow Barrington businesses to expand their operations outdoors.
 - ii. On August 24, 2020, the Select Board voted to extend the waiver through 12/31/2020.
 - iii. In consultation with the Town Planner, Building Inspector, Fire Chief, and Police Chief, I am requesting that the Select Board consider extending the deadline to June 1, 2021. This should allow any business a reasonable amount of time to bring an application before the Planning Board if they wish to continue their expanded operations beyond June 1st.
 - iv. The Select Board is asked to consider extending the waiver of site review requirements for local restaurants and the cinema for outdoor operations through June 1, 2021.
- c. Highway Garage Office Renovation Vote
 - i. On October 5th, the Select Board voted to purchase and install a semipermanent jobsite trailer at the Highway Garage. The trailer purchase was \$75,053, not including the necessary site work and utility hookups. The total cost was estimated to be \$100,000.
 - ii. The Road Agent was extremely appreciative of the Board's swift action to make improvements in his Department's working environments but began feeling that the cost vs. benefit was getting out of balance. As previously discussed, in order to protect the Town's interests (and funds), the Road Agent began evaluating a limited renovation of the existing facility instead.
 - iii. Marc worked with the Building Inspector to develop a scope of work for the potential renovation. The work would include creating and isolating two offices and a customer service window on the first floor of the existing building. This would involve moving the stairs, installing windows, installing a split system for HVAC and making the upstairs available for onsite file storage. The accompanying electrical work would be performed by the Town's Electrician of Record and is estimated to cost \$5,000-\$7,000.
 - iv. Marc worked with four local contractors to receive quotes for the specified scope of work.

- v. Based on price, references, availability, and submitted materials, Marc recommends selecting Malone Builders and Contractors. Including the electrical (\$5,000-\$7,000), and a 10% contingency, this project is expected to cost no more than \$50,000; half of the cost that a semi-permanent jobsite trailer would have been.
- vi. We propose utilizing the same funding source as approved for the jobsite trailer; unspent 2020 appropriations. The Advisory Budget Committee previously supported this funding source.
- vii. The Select Board is asked to consider awarding the Highway Garage office renovation project to Malone Builders and Contractors utilizing up to \$50,000 of available 2020 surplus funds.
- 4. New Business
 - a. Additional Meeting December 28, 2020 RSA 41:14-a Discussion
 - i. The RSA 41:14-a process requires strict scheduling (two hearings, two weeks apart and a vote 7-14 days after the second hearing). The Select Board's schedule does not align with the required timeline until February. As an alternative, the Board has agreed to add a meeting on December 28th with an agenda limited to the statutory RSA 41:14-a process. This will be a properly noticed virtual meeting starting at 6:30pm.
